Public Procurement

Results – 2023:



Further transformation and adaptation of procurement to martial law conditions:

- prohibition to purchase goods, works and services from persons associated with the russian federation/republic of belarus;
- the formation of the TIC VRU on issues of violations in public procurement;
- Mandatory publication of the justification for procurement without the use of the electronic system – for procurements worth UAH 50,000 and more;
- purchase of goods through the electronic catalogue – by request for the price offers rather than a direct procurement;
- changes regarding the customer's right to determine information about product characteristics and permissible values in procurement using an electronic catalogue;
- the AMCU confirmed the right to specify such a requirement for procurement participants as the absence in the list of international war sponsors;
- changes regarding the composition of the cost of defense contracts and the procedure for conducting procurement;



Return of auctions to open bidding.



The cancelation of the procedure for annual confirmation of compliance with the localization criteria of the current year for goods included in the list in previous years;



implementation of the annual formation of the list of goods that are the subject of the procurement, with a confirmed degree of localization based on annually submitted applications.



The establishment of new AMCU commissions for handling procurement complaints.



The Prozorro system was integrated with the Unified State Register of Persons Who Have Committed Acts of Corruption or Corruption-Related Offenses.



Strategic analysis by the NACP "Corruption risks during public procurement under martial law (as of June 2023)".

Expectations for 2024:



Functioning of the electronic contracting system



Possible introduction of new procurement methods (dynamic procurement system (DPS), aggregated, joint procurement)



Further adaptation of legislation to the realities of the martial law
